Conservation Districts are local units of government which promote soil and water conservation. Each of South Carolina's 46 counties has a Conservation District, and each District coordinates county-specific educational and technical programs. The South Carolina Association of Conservation Districts (SCACD) and the individual Conservation Districts of South Carolina support several statewide youth education programs.



Conservation Poster Contest

The annual National Conservation Poster Contest provides kindergarten through twelfth grade students an opportunity to convey their thoughts about soil, water, and related natural resource issues through art. Poster contests begin at the District level each year. CoCoRaHS, the Community Collaborative Rain, Hail, and Snow Network, is a network of volunteers who take daily precipitation measurements. Envirothon



The Envirothon is North America's largest high school environmental science competition. Teams of students compete for the state title in a one-day event that tests their knowledge of aquatics, forestry, soils, wildlife, and a current environmental topic. The winning team from South
