AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF RICHLAND COUNTY, SOUTH CAROLINA, AMENDING THE ZONING MAP OF UNINCORPORATED RICHLAND COUNTY, SOUTH CAROLINA, TO CHANGE THE ZONING DESIGNATION FOR THE REAL PROPERTY DESCRIBED AS TMS # 02307-01-07 FROM RS-LD (RESIDENTIAL, SINGLE-FAMILY – LIGHT DENSITY DISTRICT) TO RU (RURAL DISTRICT); AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Article VIII of the South Carolina Constitution and Section 4-9-30 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina (the Home Rule Act) gives Richland County broad authority to provide a variety of services and functions within its jurisdiction, including, but not limited to, land use planning and land development regulation, and similar activities and services; and

WHEREAS, Title 6, Chapter 29, of the Code of Laws of South Carolina provides the statutory enabling authority for Richland County to engage in planning and regulation of development within its jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, Section 6-29-720 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina requires the County to adopt the Land Use Element of its Comprehensive Plan in conformance with the requirements therein as a prerequisite to continuing implementation of its zoning authority; and

WHEREAS, the County Council adopted a Comprehensive Plan on May 3, 1999, in conformance with the requirements Title 6, Chapter 29, of the Code of Laws of South Carolina; and

WHEREAS, Section 6-29-760 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina provides the statutory authority and process to amend the Zoning Ordinance, codified as Chapter 26 of the Richland County Code of Ordinances; and

WHEREAS, this Ordinance complies with the requirements of Section 6-29-760 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina and the ordinance adoption process proscribed in Section 2-28 of the Richland County Code of Ordinances.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority granted by the Constitution and the General Assembly of the State of South Carolina, BE IT ENACTED BY THE RICHLAND COUNTY COUNCIL:

<u>Section I</u>. The Zoning Map of unincorporated Richland County is hereby amended to change the real property described as TMS # 02307-01-07 from RS-LD (Residential, Single-Family – Light Density District) zoning to RU (Rural District) zoning.

Section II. If any section, subsection, or clause of this Ordinance shall be deemed to be unconstitutional, or otherwise invalid, the validity of the remaining sections, subsections, and clauses shall not be affected thereby. Section III. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed. **Section IV**. This ordinance shall be effective from and after , 2006. - a) The applicant shall comply with the Master Plan (dated 3/28/06 and revised through 10/31/06) and Master Zoning Plan (dated 3/28/06 and revised through 9/21/06) prepared for Boyleston Plantation by MW&W Richland, LLC/Brian Murphree & Associates LLC; which was submitted to, and is on file in, the Richland County Planning & Development Services Department (hereinafter referred to as "PDSD"), and is incorporated herein by reference, except as otherwise amended herein; and
- b) The site development shall be limited to 378 "single-family medium density" units; 260 "multi-family high density" units; 44 "single-family high density" units; 4 "neighborhood commercial" units; 18 "office/institutional" units, and 6 "general commercial" outparcels; and
- c) The applicant shall transmit a phasing plan to the PDSD prior to such department's review of any construction plans; and
- d) Unless otherwise provided herein, all development shall conform to all relevant land development regulations in effect at the time a permit application is received by the PDSD; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Milhous concluded his examination and submitted a report to the Richland County Council (the "County Council"), which identified failures of the City under the 1999 Agreement, which the County believes constitute Material City Events of Default under the terms of the 1999 Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the County has informed the City of the occurrence of said Material City Events of Default; and

WHEREAS, as a result of such Material City Events of Default, the County believes that it has suffered financial loss; and

WHEREAS, the County is desirous of attempting to resolve this dispute with the City in an amicable manner.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Richland County, as follows:

- **SECTION 1.** Agreement with the City. The form of the Agreement attached hereto is hereby approved and the County Administrator is hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver same for purposes of binding the County to the terms thereof.

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into as of the _____ day of _____, 2006 by and between the City of Columbia, South Carolina (the "City") and Richland County, South Carolina (the "County").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the City is an incorporated municipality, the greater portion of which is located in the County, and possesses all powers granted to municipalities by the Constitution and general laws of the State of South Carolina (the "State"); and,

WHEREAS, the County is a body politic and corporate and a political subdivision of the State and possesses all powers granted to counties pursuant to the Constitution and general laws of the State; and,

WHEREAS, in October 1999 the City and the County entered into an "Agreement to Modify Congaree Vista Redevelopment District and to Provide for Additional Tax Increment Financing" (the "1999 Agreement"), a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A; and,

WHEREAS, the 1999 Agreement provided for, among other things, certain events of default and certain remedies in the event of default, including a provision under which the County may withhold from any tax collections due to the City amounts required to satisfy the City's obligations under the 1999 Agreement; and,

WHEREAS, the County retained the services of Robert Milhous, CPA, to conduct an examination to determine whether the City had complied the 1999 Agreement in its management and accounting of the revenues being generated by properties located in the Redevelopment District; and,

WHEREAS, Robert Milhous, CPA, has completed his examination and reported his finding to the County, such examination and findings being incorporated by reference into this Agreement and referred to hereinafter as the "Milhous Examination"; and,

WHEREAS, based on the Milhous Examination, the County, on April 17, 2006, provided written notice of the occurrence of one or more Material City Events of Default under the 1999 Agreement; and,

WHEREAS, the County has notified by City that the County is prepared to avail itself of the various remedies provided in the 1999 Agreement, including, but not limited to, the withholding of tax payments due to the City; and,

WHEREAS, the City has disputed that it is in default of the 1999 Agreement and generally disagreed with the findings of the Milhous Examination; and

WHEREAS, the City and the County wish to amicably resolve this dispute by hiring an independent third party to undertake an examination of the City's compliance with the requirements of the 1999 Agreement.

NOW THEREFORE, in order to settle the differences between them, the City and the County, for good and valuable consideration, the sufficient of which is hereby acknowledge, agree as follows.

AGREEMENT

1. Third Party Examination. The County and the City agree to retain the services of [insert name], a certified public accounting firm (the "Examiner"), for the purpose of conducting an independent third party examination (the "New Examination") to (a) assess the City's compliance with the requirements of the 1999 Agreement (from the inception of the 1999 Agreement to present), (b) determine if any non-compliance has occurred, and (c) to the extent non-compliance has occurred, quantify the financial loss to the County resulting therefrom.

Both the City and the County shall provide full access to the Examiner to all records, including the Milhous Examination, in custody of the City or the County, or in the custody of any third parties under the control of the City or the County.

The cost of the New Examination shall be divided equally between the County and the City. The City and the County agree that the engagement agreement for the New Examination shall require that the New Examination be completed and a report submitted to the City and the County no later than 60 days following commencement of the New Examination. In addition to the other matters addressed herein, the report of the Examiner shall specifically address any differences in the findings of the New Examination versus the Milhous Examination.

- 2. **New Examination Binding and In Lieu of Further Remedies.** Both the County and the City agree that, as to the claims addressed by the New Examination, the parties shall be bound by the results of the New Examination, as set forth in <u>Section 3</u> below, and such results shall be a final determination of the matter in controversy between them, and shall not be subject to further appeals or negotiation.
- 3. Results of New Examination. (A) If the results of the New Examination conclude that the County has incurred financial loss, the County shall, in accordance with the 1999 Agreement, withhold from the City tax revenues to which the City would have otherwise been entitled in a sum satisfactory to remedy the financial loss outlined in the New Examination. The County will instruct the County Treasurer to withhold such amounts from the City in one or more years, which amounts shall satisfy the City's obligations to remedy a "Material City Event of Default", as defined under the 1999 Agreement. In such event, the City agrees to such withhold and that it will not take any action against the County Treasurer or the County, or any other party, to prevent or delay the County Treasurer's collection or withholding of funds from the City described herein.
- (B) If the results of the New Examination do not show the County has incurred financial loss, the County shall cease the pursuit of its claims for financial damages with respect

to the items covered by the New Examination and shall take no further action with regard thereto.

The parties acknowledge that this Agreement contains the full and complete agreement between them, and that there are no oral or implied agreements or understandings not specifically so set forth. Each party acknowledges that no other party or attorney of any other party, or any person, firm, corporation or any other entity has made any promise, representation, or warranty whatsoever, express, implied or statutory, not contained herein, concerning the subject matter hereof, to induce the execution of this Agreement. Each signatory also hereby acknowledges that it has not executed this Agreement in reliance on any promise, representation or warranty not contained herein. This Agreement may not be modified or amended except by written instrument signed on behalf of both parties by duly authorized representatives, which instrument must have been approved by ordinances of the County Council and the City Council, respectively. In the event and to the extent (but only to the extent) that any provision or any portion of any provision of this Agreement shall be held invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not invalidate or render unenforceable the remainder of that provision or any other provision or part of provision of this Agreement. This Agreement may be executed with one or more separate counterparts, each of which, when so executed, shall, together, constitute one and the same instrument.

STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA COUNTY COUNCIL FOR RICHLAND COUNTY ORDINANCE NO. -07HR

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OF RICHLAND COUNTY, SOUTH CAROLINA, TO BE ISSUED IN ONE OR MORE SERIES, WITH APPROPRIATE SERIES DESIGNATIONS IN THE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF NOT EXCEEDING \$4,000,000; FIXING THE FORM AND DETAILS OF THE BONDS; AUTHORIZING THE INTERIM ADMINISTRATOR OF THE COUNTY TO DETERMINE CERTAIN MATTERS RELATING TO THE BONDS; PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT OF THE BONDS AND THE DISPOSITION OF THE PROCEEDS THEREOF; AND OTHER MATTERS RELATING THERETO.

Pursuant to the authority by the Constitution of the State of South Carolina and the General Assembly of the State of South Carolina, BE IT ENACTED BY RICHLAND COUNTY COUNCIL:

<u>SECTION 1</u>. <u>Findings and Determinations</u>. The County Council (the "County Council") of Richland County, South Carolina (the "County"), hereby finds and determines:

- (a) Pursuant to Section 4-9-10, Code of Laws of South Carolina 1976, as amended, the County operates under the Council-Administrator form of government and the County Council constitutes the governing body of the County.
- (b) Article X, Section 14 of the Constitution of the State of South Carolina, 1895, as amended (the "Constitution"), provides that each county shall have the power to incur bonded indebtedness in such manner and upon such terms and conditions as the General Assembly shall prescribe by general law. Such debt must be incurred for a public purpose and a corporate purpose in an amount not exceeding eight percent (8%) of the assessed value of all taxable property of such county.
- (c) Pursuant to Title 4, Chapter 15 of the Code (the same being and hereinafter referred to as the "County Bond Act"), the governing bodies of the several counties of the State may each issue general obligation bonds to defray the cost of any authorized purpose and for any amount not exceeding their applicable constitutional limit.
- (d) The County Bond Act provides that as a condition precedent to the issuance of bonds an election be held and the result be favorable thereto. Title 11, Chapter 27 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina 1976, as amended, provides that if an election be prescribed by the provisions of the County Bond Act, but not be required by the provisions of Article X of the Constitution, then in every such instance, no election need be held (notwithstanding the requirement therefor) and the remaining provisions of the County Bond Act shall constitute a full and complete authorization to issue bonds in accordance with such remaining provisions.
- (e) The approximate assessed value of all the taxable property in the County as of December 31, 2005, for purposes of computation of the County's constitutional debt limit, is \$1,195,869,413 which excludes exempt manufacturing property. Eight percent of such sum is \$95,669,553. As of the date hereof, the outstanding general obligation debt of the County subject to the limitation imposed by Article X, Section 14(7) of the Constitution is \$51,824,230. Thus, the County may incur not exceeding \$43,845,323 of additional general obligation debt within its applicable debt limitation. Prior to the date hereof, the County authorized the issuance of general obligation bonds in the principal amount of not exceeding \$4,000,000

which are subject to the County's constitutional debt limit. At the time of issuance of these general obligation bonds, the County's constitutional debt limit capacity will be issued by the amount of general obligation bonds actually issued.

(f) It is now in the best interest of the County for the County Council to provide for the issuance and sale of not exceeding \$4,000,000 general obligation bonds of the County pursuant to the aforesaid provisions of the Constitution and laws of the State of South Carolina, the proceeds of which will be used to provide funds for (i) acquisition, construction and equipping a facility to be owned by the County and operated as an animal shelter; (ii) a portion of the costs for the acquisition, construction and equipping a facility to be owned by a nonprofit corporation and operated as an animal shelter; (iii) legal fees and costs of issuance of the bonds; and (iv) such other lawful corporate and public purposes as the County Council shall determine.

SECTION 2. Authorization and Details of Bonds. Pursuant to the aforesaid provisions of the Constitution and laws of the State, there is hereby authorized to be issued not exceeding \$4,000,000 aggregate principal amount of general obligation bonds of the County in one or more series to be designated "Not exceeding \$4,000,000 (or such other amount as may be issued) General Obligation Bonds of Richland County, South Carolina" (the "Bonds") for the purpose stated in Section 1(f) of this Ordinance. The Bonds shall have an appropriate series designation.

The Bonds shall be issued as fully registered Bonds registerable as to principal and interest; shall be dated as of the first day of the month in which they are delivered to the initial purchaser(s) thereof; shall be in denominations of \$5,000 or any integral multiple thereof not exceeding principal amount of Bonds maturing each year; shall be numbered from R-l upward, respectively; shall bear interest from their date payable at such times as hereafter designated by the Interim Administrator of the County (the "Interim Administrator") at such rate or rates as may be determined by the County Council at the time of sale thereof; and shall mature serially in successive annual installments as determined by the Interim Administrator.

Without further authorization, the County Council hereby delegates to the Interim Administrator the authority to determine (a) the maturity dates of the Bonds and the respective principal amounts maturing on such dates; (b) the interest payment dates of the Bonds; (c) redemption provisions, if any, for the Bonds; (d) the time and date of sale of the Bonds; and (e) the registrar/paying agent for the Bonds, subject to the terms and conditions stated below. The County Council delegates to the Interim Administrator the authority to designate the Bonds as "qualified tax-exempt obligations" within the meaning of Section 265(b)(3)(B) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. The County Council further delegates to the Interim Administrator the authority to receive bids on behalf of County Council and the authority to award the Bonds to the lowest bidder therefor, provided the true interest cost does not exceed 6%. After the sale of the Bonds, the Interim Administrator shall submit a written report to County Council setting forth the details of the Bonds as set forth in this paragraph.

Both the principal of and interest on the Bonds shall be payable in any coin or currency of the United States of America which is, at the time of payment, legal tender for public and private debts. The Registrar/Paying Agent shall be a bank, trust company, depository or transfer agent located either within or without the State of South Carolina.

SECTION 3. Registration, Transfer and Exchange of Bonds. The County shall cause books (herein referred to as the "registry books") to be kept at the offices of the Registrar/Paying Agent, for the registration and transfer of the Bonds. Upon presentation at its office for such purpose the Registrar/Paying Agent shall register or transfer, or cause to be registered or transferred, on such registry books, the Bonds under such reasonable regulations as the Registrar/Paying Agent may prescribe.

Each Bond shall be transferable only upon the registry books of the County, which shall be kept for such purpose at the principal office of the Registrar/Paying Agent, by the registered owner thereof in person or by his duly authorized attorney upon surrender thereof together with a written instrument of transfer satisfactory to the Registrar/Paying Agent duly executed by the registered owner or his duly authorized attorney. Upon the transfer of any such Bond the Registrar/Paying Agent on behalf of the County shall issue in the name of the transferee a new fully-registered Bond or Bonds, of the same aggregate principal amount, interest rate and maturity as the surrendered Bond. Any Bond surrendered in exchange for a new registered Bond pursuant to this Section shall be canceled by the Registrar/Paying Agent.

The County and the Registrar/Paying Agent may deem or treat the person in whose name any fully-registered Bond shall be registered upon the registry books as the absolute owner of such Bond, whether such Bond shall be overdue or not, for the purpose of receiving payment of the principal of and interest on such Bond and for all other purposes and all such payments so made to any such registered owner or upon his order shall be valid and effectual to satisfy and discharge the liability upon such Bond to the extent of the sum or sums so paid, and neither the County nor the Registrar/Paying Agent shall be affected by any notice to the contrary. For every such transfer of Bonds, the County or the Registrar/Paying Agent may make a charge sufficient to reimburse it for any tax, fee or other governmental charge required to be paid with respect to such transfer, and, except as otherwise provided herein, may charge a sum sufficient to pay the cost of preparing each Bond issued upon such transfer, which sum or sums shall be paid by the person requesting such transfer or by the County as a condition precedent to the exercise of the privilege of making such transfer. Neither the County nor the Registrar/Paying Agent shall be obliged to make any such transfer of Bonds during the fifteen (15) days preceding an interest payment date on such Bonds.

SECTION 4. Record Date. The County hereby establishes a record date for the payment of interest or for the giving of notice of any proposed redemption of Bonds, and such record date shall be the fifteenth (15th) day of the calendar month preceding each semiannual interest payment date on such Bond or in the case of any proposed redemption of Bonds, such record date shall be the fifteenth (15th) day prior to the giving of notice of redemption of bonds.

SECTION 5. Mutilation, Loss, Theft or Destruction of Bonds. In case any Bond shall at any time become mutilated in whole or in part, or be lost, stolen or destroyed, or be so defaced as to impair the value thereof to the owner, the County shall execute and the Registrar shall authenticate and deliver at the principal office of the Registrar, or send by registered mail to the owner thereof at his request, risk and expense a new Bond of the same series, interest rate and maturity and of like tenor and effect in exchange or substitution for and upon the surrender for cancellation of such defaced, mutilated or partly destroyed Bond, or in lieu of or in substitution for such lost, stolen or destroyed Bond. In any such event the applicant for the issuance of a substitute Bond shall furnish the County and the Registrar evidence or proof satisfactory to the County and the Registrar of the loss, destruction, mutilation, defacement or theft of the original Bond, and of the ownership thereof, and also such security and indemnity in an amount as may be required by the laws of the State of South Carolina or such greater amount as may be required by the County and the Registrar. Any duplicate Bond issued under the provisions of this Section in exchange and substitution for any defaced, mutilated or partly destroyed Bond or in substitution for any allegedly lost, stolen or wholly destroyed Bond shall be entitled to the identical benefits under this Ordinance as was the original Bond in lieu of which such duplicate Bond is issued, and shall be entitled to equal and proportionate benefits with all the other Bonds of the same series issued hereunder.

All expenses necessary for the providing of any duplicate Bond shall be borne by the applicant therefor.

SECTION 6. Execution of Bonds. The Bonds shall be executed in the name of the County with the facsimile signature of the Chair of the County Council attested by the facsimile signature of the Clerk of the County Council under a facsimile of the seal of the County impressed, imprinted or reproduced thereon; provided, however, the facsimile signatures appearing on the Bonds may be those of the officers who are in office on the date of adoption of this Ordinance. The execution of the Bonds in such fashion shall be valid and effectual, notwithstanding any subsequent change in such offices. The Bonds shall not be valid or become obligatory for any purpose unless there shall have been endorsed thereon a certificate of authentication. Each Bond shall bear a certificate of authentication manually executed by the Registrar in substantially the form set forth herein.

<u>SECTION 7.</u> Form of Bonds. The Bonds and the certificate of authentication shall be in substantially the form as set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

SECTION 8. Security for Bonds. The full faith, credit and taxing power of the County are hereby irrevocably pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on the Bonds as they respectively mature, and for the creation of such sinking fund as may be necessary therefor. There shall be levied annually by the Auditor of the County, and collected by the Treasurer of the County, in the same manner as other county taxes are levied and collected, a tax, without limit, on all taxable property in the County sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the Bonds as they respectively mature and to create such sinking fund as may be necessary therefor.

The County Council, acting through its Chair, shall give the Auditor and Treasurer of the County written notice of the delivery of and payment for the Bonds and they are hereby directed to levy and collect annually, on all taxable property in the County, a tax, without limit, sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the Bonds as they respectively mature and to create such sinking fund as may be necessary therefor.

SECTION 9. Notice of Initiative and Referendum. The County Council hereby delegates to its Chair and the Interim Administrator the authority to determine whether the Notice prescribed under the provisions of Title 11, Chapter 27, relating to the Initiative and Referendum provisions contained in Title 4, Chapter 9 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina 1976, as amended, shall be given with respect to this Ordinance, such notice being in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit B. If such notice is given, the Chair and the Interim Administrator are authorized to cause such notice to be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the County.

<u>SECTION 10.</u> <u>Defeasance.</u> The obligations of the County under this Ordinance and the pledges, covenants and agreements of the County herein made or provided for, shall be fully discharged and satisfied as to any portion of the Bonds, and such Bond or Bonds shall no longer be deemed to be outstanding hereunder when:

- (a) Such Bond or Bonds shall have been purchased by the County and surrendered to the County for cancellation or otherwise surrendered to the County or the Paying Agent and is canceled or subject to cancellation by the County or the Paying Agent; or
- (b) Payment of the principal of and interest on such Bonds either (i) shall have been made or caused to be made in accordance with the terms thereof, or (ii) shall have been provided for by irrevocably depositing with a corporate trustee to be named in trust and irrevocably set aside exclusively for such payment, (1) moneys sufficient to make such payment, or (2) Government Obligations (hereinafter defined) maturing as to principal and interest in such amounts and at such times as will ensure the availability of sufficient moneys to make such payment and all necessary and proper fees, compensation and

expenses of the Paying Agent. At such time as the Bonds shall no longer be deemed to be outstanding hereunder, such Bonds shall cease to draw interest from the due date thereof and, except for the purposes of any such payment from such moneys or Government Obligations, shall no longer be secured by or entitled to the benefits of this Ordinance.

"Government Obligations" shall mean any of the following:

- (a) direct obligations of the United States of America or agencies thereof or obligations, the payment of principal or interest on which, in the opinion of the Attorney General of the United States, is fully and unconditionally guaranteed by the United States of America; and
- (b) Non-callable, U.S. Treasury Securities State and Local Government Series ("SLGS").

SECTION 11. Exemption from State Taxes. Both the principal of and interest on the Bonds shall be exempt, in accordance with the provisions of Section 12-2-50 of the Code, from all State, county, municipal, school district and all other taxes or assessments, except estate or other transfer taxes, direct or indirect, general or special, whether imposed for the purpose of general revenue or otherwise.

SECTION 12. Eligible Securities. The Bonds initially issued (the "Initial Bonds") will be eligible securities for the purposes of the book-entry system of transfer maintained by The Depository Trust Company, New York, New York ("DTC"), and transfers of beneficial ownership of the Initial Bonds shall be made only through DTC and its participants in accordance with rules specified by DTC. Such beneficial ownership must be of \$5,000 principal amount of Bonds of the same maturity or any integral multiple of \$5,000.

The Initial Bonds shall be issued in fully-registered form, one Bond for each of the maturities of the Bonds, in the name of Cede & Co., as the nominee of DTC. When any principal of or interest on the Initial Bonds becomes due, the Paying Agent, on behalf of the County, shall transmit to DTC an amount equal to such installment of principal and interest. DTC shall remit such payments to the beneficial owners of the Bonds or their nominees in accordance with its rules and regulations.

Notices of redemption of the Initial Bonds or any portion thereof shall be sent to DTC in accordance with the provisions of the Ordinance.

If (a) DTC determines not to continue to act as securities depository for the Bonds, or (b) the County has advised DTC of its determination that DTC is incapable of discharging its duties, the County shall attempt to retain another qualified securities depository to replace DTC. Upon receipt by the County the Initial Bonds together with an assignment duly executed by DTC, the County shall execute and deliver to the successor securities depository Bonds of the same principal amount, interest rate and maturity registered in the name of such successor.

If the County is unable to retain a qualified successor to DTC or the County has determined that it is in its best interest not to continue the book-entry system of transfer or that interests of the beneficial owners of the Bonds might be adversely affected if the book-entry system of transfer is continued (the County undertakes no obligation to make any investigation to determine the occurrence of any events that would permit it to make any such determination), and has made provision to so notify beneficial owners of the Bonds by mailing an appropriate notice to DTC, upon receipt by the County of the Initial Bonds together with an assignment duly executed by DTC, the County shall execute, authenticate and deliver to the DTC

participants Bonds in fully-registered form, in substantially the form set forth in Section 2 of this Ordinance in the denomination of \$5,000 or any integral multiple thereof.

SECTION 13. Sale of Bonds, Form of Notice of Sale. The Bonds shall be offered for public sale on the date and at the time designated by the Interim Administrator. A Notice of Sale shall be distributed to prospective bidders and a summary of such Notice of Sale shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the State of South Carolina and/or in a financial publication published in the City of New York not less than seven (7) days prior to the date set for such sale.

The Notice of Sale shall be in substantially the form as set forth in Exhibit C attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

SECTION 14. Preliminary and Final Official Statement. The County Council hereby authorizes and directs the Interim Administrator to prepare, or cause to be prepared, a Preliminary Official Statement to be distributed to prospective purchasers of the Bonds together with the Notice of Sale. The County Council authorizes the Interim Administrator to designate the Preliminary Official Statement as "near final" for purposes of Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities Exchange Commission. The Interim Administrator is further authorized to see to the completion of the final form of the Official Statement upon the sale of the Bonds so that it may be provided to the purchaser of the Bonds.

SECTION 15. Filings with Central Repository. In compliance with Section 11-1-85, South Carolina Code of Laws 1976, as amended, the County covenants that it will file or cause to be filed with a central repository for availability in the secondary bond market when requested: (a) a copy of an annual independent audit of the County within thirty (30) days of the County's receipt thereof; and (b) within thirty (30) days of the occurrence thereof, event specific information of an event which adversely affects more than five (5%) percent of the tax revenues of the County or the County's tax base.

SECTION 16. Continuing Disclosure. In compliance with the Securities and Exchange Commission Rule 15c2-12 (the "Rule") the County covenants and agrees for the benefit of the holders from time to time of the Bonds to execute and deliver prior to closing, and to thereafter comply with the terms of a Disclosure Dissemination Agent Agreement in substantially the form appearing as Exhibit D to this Ordinance. In the event of a failure of the County to comply with any of the provisions of the Continuing Disclosure Certificate, an event of default under this Ordinance shall not be deemed to have occurred. In such event, the sole remedy of any bondholder or beneficial owner shall be an action to compel performance by the Ordinance.

SECTION 17. Deposit and Use of Proceeds. The proceeds derived from the sale of the Bonds shall be deposited with the Treasurer of the County in a special fund to the credit of the County, separate and distinct from all other funds, and shall be expended from time to time and made use of by the County Council as follows:

- (a) Any premium shall be placed in the sinking fund established pursuant to Section 4-15-I50 of the Code;
- (b) Accrued interest, if any, shall be applied to the payment of the first installment of interest to become due on the Bonds; and
- (c) The balance of the proceeds shall be applied upon warrant or order of the County Council for the purposes set forth in this Ordinance and to defray the costs and expenses of issuing the Bonds.

SECTION 18. Notice of Public Hearing. The County Council hereby ratifies and approves the publication of a notice of public hearing regarding the Bonds and this Ordinance, such notice in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit E, having been published in *The State*, a newspaper of general circulation in the County, not less than 15 days prior to the date of such public hearing.

<u>SECTION 19</u>. <u>Tax Covenants</u>. The County covenants that no use of the proceeds of the sale of the Bonds shall be made which, if such use had been reasonably expected on the date of issue of such Bonds would have caused the Bonds to be "arbitrage bonds", as defined in Section 148 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (the "IRC"), and to that end the County hereby shall:

- (a) Comply with the applicable provisions of Section 103 and Sections 141 through 150 of the IRC and any regulations promulgated thereunder so long as any of the Bonds are outstanding;
- (b) Establish such funds, make such calculations and pay such amounts, in the manner and at the times required in order to comply with the requirements of the IRC relating to required rebates of certain amounts to the United States;
 - (c) Make such reports of such information at the times and places required by the IRC; and
- (d) Not take any action which will, or fail to take any action which failure will, cause interest on the Bonds to become includable in the gross income of the bondholders for federal income tax purposes pursuant to the provisions of the IRC and regulations promulgated thereunder in effect on the date of original issuance of the Bonds.

SECTION 20. Miscellaneous. The County Council hereby authorizes any one or more of the following officials to execute such documents and instruments as necessary to effect the issuance of the Bonds: Chair of the County Council, Interim County Administrator, Clerk to the County Council and County Attorney. The County Council hereby retains McNair Law Firm, P.A. as bond counsel in connection with the issuance of the Bonds.

All rules, regulations, resolutions and parts thereof, procedural or otherwise, in conflict herewith or the proceedings authorizing the issuance of the Bonds are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed and this Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its adoption.

Notice of obtaining a commitment for such insurance will be transmitted via Munifacts. Upon such reminder, the Disclosure Representative shall either (i) provide the Disclosure Dissemination Agent with an electronic copy of the Annual Report and the Certification) no later than two (2) business days prior to the Annual Filing Date, or (ii) instruct the Disclosure Dissemination Agent in writing that the Issuer will not be able to file the Annual Report within the time required under this Disclosure Agreement, state the date by which the Annual Report for such year will be provided and instruct the Disclosure Dissemination Agent that a Notice Event as described in Section 4(a)(12) has occurred and to immediately send a notice to each National Repository or the MSRB and the State Depository (if any) in substantially the form attached as Exhibit B.

- (c) If the Disclosure Dissemination Agent has not received an Annual Report and Certification by 12:00 noon on the first business day following the Annual Filing Date for the Annual Report, a Notice Event described in Section 4(a)(12) shall have occurred and the Issuer irrevocably directs the Disclosure Dissemination Agent to immediately send a notice to each National Repository or the MSRB and the State Depository (if any) in substantially the form attached as Exhibit B.

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The Issuer shall promptly notify the Disclosure Dissemination Agent in writing upon the occurrence of a Notice Event. Such notice shall instruct the Disclosure Dissemination Agent to report the occurrence pursuant to subsection (c). Such notice shall be accompanied with the text of the disclosure that the Issuer desires to make, the written authorization of the Issuer for the Disclosure Dissemination Agent to disseminate such information, and the date the Issuer desires for the Disclosure Dissemination Agent to disseminate the information.

(b) The Disclosure Dissemination Agent is under no obligation to notify the Issuer or the Disclosure Representative of an event that may constitute a Notice Event. - SECTION 6. Additional Disclosure Obligations. The Issuer acknowledges and understands that other state and federal laws, including but not limited to the Securities Act of 1933 and Rule 10b-5 promulgated under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, may apply to the Issuer, and that the failure of the Disclosure Dissemination Agent to so advise the Issuer shall not constitute a breach by the Disclosure Dissemination Agent of any of its duties and responsibilities under this Disclosure Agreement. The Issuer acknowledges and understands that the duties of the Disclosure Dissemination Agent relate exclusively to execution of the mechanical tasks of disseminating information as described in this Disclosure Agreement.

SECTION 7. Voluntary Reports.

- (a) The Issuer may instruct the Disclosure Dissemination Agent to file information with the Repositories, from time to time pursuant to a Certification of the Disclosure Representative accompanying such information (a "Voluntary Report").
- (b) Nothing in this Disclosure Agreement shall be deemed to prevent the Issuer from disseminating any other information through the Disclosure Dissemination Agent using the means of dissemination set forth in this Disclosure Agreement or including any other information in any Annual Report, Annual Financial Statement, Voluntary Report or Notice Event notice, in addition to that required by this Disclosure Agreement. If the Issuer chooses to include any information in any Annual Report, Annual Financial Statement, Voluntary Report or Notice Event notice in addition to that which is specifically required by this Disclosure Agreement, the Issuer shall have no obligation under this Disclosure Agreement to update such information or include it in any future Annual Report, Annual Financial Statement, Voluntary Report or Notice Event notice.
- SECTION 8. <u>Termination of Reporting Obligation</u>. The obligations of the Issuer and the Disclosure Dissemination Agent under this Disclosure Agreement shall terminate with respect to the Bonds upon the legal defeasance, prior redemption or payment in full of all of the Bonds, when the Issuer is no longer an obligated person with respect to the Bonds, or upon delivery by the Disclosure Representative to the Disclosure Dissemination Agent of an opinion of nationally recognized bond counsel to the effect that continuing disclosure is no longer required.

SECTION 9. <u>Disclosure Dissemination Agent</u>. The Issuer has appointed Digital Assurance Certification, L.L.C. as exclusive Disclosure Dissemination Agent under this Disclosure Agreement. The Issuer may, upon thirty days written notice to the Disclosure Dissemination Agent and the Trustee, replace or appoint a successor Disclosure Dissemination Agent. Upon termination of DAC's services as Disclosure Dissemination Agent, whether by notice of the Issuer or DAC, the Issuer agrees to appoint a successor Disclosure Dissemination Agent or, alternately, agrees to assume all responsibilities of Disclosure Dissemination Agent under this Disclosure Agreement for the benefit of the Holders of the Bonds. Notwithstanding any replacement or appointment of a successor, the Issuer shall remain liable until payment in full for any and all sums owed and payable to the Disclosure Dissemination Agent. The Disclosure Dissemination Agent may resign at any time by providing thirty days' prior written notice to the Issuer.

SECTION 10. Remedies in Event of Default. In the event of a failure of the Issuer or the Disclosure Dissemination Agent to comply with any provision of this Disclosure Agreement, the Holders' rights to enforce the provisions of this Agreement shall be limited solely to a right, by action in mandamus or for specific performance, to compel performance of the parties' obligation under this Disclosure Agreement. Any failure by a party to perform in accordance with this Disclosure Agreement shall not constitute a default on the Bonds or under any other document relating to the Bonds, and all rights and remedies shall be limited to those expressly stated herein.

SECTION 11. Duties, Immunities and Liabilities of Disclosure Dissemination Agent.

(a) The Disclosure Dissemination Agent shall have only such duties as are specifically set forth in this Disclosure Agreement. The Disclosure Dissemination Agent's obligation to deliver the information at the times and with the contents described herein shall be limited to the extent the Issuer has provided such information to the Disclosure Dissemination Agent as required by this Disclosure Agreement. The Disclosure Dissemination Agent shall have no duty with respect to the content of any disclosures or notice made pursuant to the terms hereof. The Disclosure Dissemination Agent shall have no duty or obligation to review or verify any Information or any other information, disclosures or notices provided to it by the Issuer and shall not be deemed to be acting in any fiduciary capacity for the Issuer, the Holders of the Bonds or any other party. The Disclosure Dissemination Agent shall have no responsibility for the Issuer's failure to report to the Disclosure Dissemination Agent a Notice Event or a duty to determine the materiality thereof. The Disclosure Dissemination Agent shall have no duty to determine, or liability for failing to determine, whether the Issuer has complied with this Disclosure Agreement. The Disclosure Dissemination Agent may conclusively rely upon certifications of the Issuer at all times.

THE ISSUER AGREES TO INDEMNIFY AND SAVE THE DISCLOSURE DISSEMINATION AGENT AND ITS RESPECTIVE OFFICERS, DIRECTORS, EMPLOYEES AND AGENTS, HARMLESS AGAINST ANY LOSS, EXPENSE AND LIABILITIES WHICH THEY MAY INCUR ARISING OUT OF OR IN THE EXERCISE OR PERFORMANCE OF THEIR POWERS AND DUTIES HEREUNDER, INCLUDING THE COSTS AND EXPENSES (INCLUDING ATTORNEYS FEES) OF DEFENDING AGAINST ANY CLAIM OF LIABILITY, BUT EXCLUDING LIABILITIES DUE TO THE DISCLOSURE DISSEMINATION AGENT'S GROSS NEGLIGENCE OR WILLFUL MISCONDUCT.

The obligations of the Issuer under this Section shall survive resignation or removal of the Disclosure Dissemination Agent and defeasance, redemption or payment of the Bonds.

(b) The Disclosure Dissemination Agent may, from time to time, consult with legal counsel (either in-house or external) of its own choosing in the event of any disagreement or controversy, or question or doubt as to the construction of any of the provisions hereof or its respective duties hereunder,

and neither of them shall incur any liability and shall be fully protected in acting in good faith upon the advice of such legal counsel. The fees and expenses of such counsel shall be payable by the Issuer.

SECTION 12. <u>Amendment; Waiver</u>. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Disclosure Agreement, the Issuer and the Disclosure Dissemination Agent may amend this Disclosure Agreement and any provision of this Disclosure Agreement may be waived, if such amendment or waiver is supported by an opinion of counsel expert in federal securities laws acceptable to both the Issuer and the Disclosure Dissemination Agent to the effect that such amendment or waiver does not materially impair the interests of Holders of the Bonds and would not, in and of itself, cause the undertakings herein to violate the Rule if such amendment or waiver had been effective on the date hereof but taking into account any subsequent change in or official interpretation of the Rule; provided neither the Issuer or the Disclosure Dissemination Agent shall be obligated to agree to any amendment modifying their respective duties or obligations without their consent thereto.

Notwithstanding the preceding paragraph, the Disclosure Dissemination Agent shall have the right to adopt amendments to this Disclosure Agreement necessary to comply with modifications to and interpretations of the provisions of the Rule as announced by the Securities and Exchange Commission from time to time by giving not less than 20 days written notice of the intent to do so together with a copy of the proposed amendment to the Issuer. No such amendment shall become effective if the Issuer shall, within 10 days following the giving of such notice, send a notice to the Disclosure Dissemination Agent in writing that it objects to such amendment.

SECTION 13. <u>Beneficiaries</u>. This Disclosure Agreement shall inure solely to the benefit of the Issuer, the Trustee of the Bonds, the Disclosure Dissemination Agent, the underwriter, and the Holders from time to time of the Bonds, and shall create no rights in any other person or entity.

SECTION 14. Governing Law. This Disclosure Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of New York (other than with respect to conflicts of laws).

SECTION 15. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Disclosure Agreement may be executed in several counterparts, each of which shall be an original and all of which shall constitute but one and the same instrument.

The Disclosure Dissemination Agent and the Issuer have caused this Continuing Disclosure Agreement to be executed, on the date first written above, by their respective officers duly authorized.

Richland County Council Request of Action

Subject: Owens Field Engineering Consultant

A. Purpose

County Council is requested to grant permission to the Procurement Director to negotiate and award a contract for design and engineering services to the LPA Group. Services rendered to the County for improvements by this consultancy are reimbursable through the FAA and State Aeronautics Commission at a maximum of 97.5% for improvement projects to include design and project management services.

B. Background / Discussion

Four companies (Talbert Bright, The LPA Group, Wilbur Smith and WK Dixon) responded to the Counties request for qualifications. The responses were evaluated by a team of professionals and once the scores of the team were tabulated it was determined that the highest rated responsive and responsible company was the LPA Group.

This professional service is necessary if the county is to continue to obtain grants and other discretionary funding from the FAA and State agencies for continued improvements to the facility. Currently the runway is in poor condition and replacement of the runway was moved from FY09 to FY07 in the Capital Improvement Plan submitted to the FAA in FY06 as a safety concern. Design and construction costs have to be completed by a design consultant prior to the agencies directing any funding to Richland County for these projects.

C. Financial Impact

The cost of these services can not be tabulated before an official request to develop the design has been requested and construction estimates established from the design. The end result impact to the County will be 2.5% of the total cost of the project. Council approved a budget of \$76,876 in the FY07 budget to cover 2.5% of the estimated funds that the FAA and State agencies could be made available for the pavement rejuvenation project for the airport. With these funds in place only the professional services portion remain to be funded by the County.

D. Alternatives

- 1. Approve the request to negotiate and award a contract to the LPA Group and continue to make major improvements to this facility.
- 2. Do not approve permission to negotiate and award a contract to the LPA Group and lose all funding for facility improvement from the FAA and State agencies. Forfeiting these funds will require that the County fund the multi-million dollar project for runway repairs as the failing pavement is becoming a safety concern that will continue to deteriorate.

It is recommended for County Council to approve recommendation #1 and allow negotiate and award a contract to the LPA Group

John Hartz joined the Wisconsin Department of Transportation in 1970. His first responsibility was to define the State of Wisconsin's role in the preservation and improvement of mass transit. He played a key role in creating and managing the state mass transit aid programs from 1970 through 1989. He became the Department's principle planner for intercity passenger rail in 1990 and his planning responsibilities were broadened to include all modes of intercity transportation in 1993.

PROGRAM & PLANNING ANALYST 7 - SUPERVISOR

Wisconsin Department of Transportation (1990-Present)

From 1993 to the present, John Hartz has served as Supervisor of Multimodal Planning. In this capacity, he supervises professional staff and manages private consultants in the preparation of statewide modal and multimodal system plans for Wisconsin's railroads, airports and harbors and in the preparation of passenger rail plans for major intercity travel corridors.

As Supervisor of Multimodal Planning, John Hartz has:

- Managed a detailed feasibility study of high speed rail options between Chicago and Milwaukee culminating with the publication of a *Final Report* in May 1997. The amount of funds expended on consultant services for this study was nearly \$1 million.
- Managed the production of a new State Airport System Plan culminating with the publication of a *Draft Final Report* in August 1999. The amount of funds expended on consultant services for this planning effort exceeded \$415,000.
- Played a key role on the staff team responsible for the production of the intercity element of the statewide multimodal transportation plan, *Translinks 21*, which was formally adopted by the Department in November 1994. The amount of funds expended on consultant services for the intercity element exceeded \$550,000.
- Managed the creation of one of the nation's first state Geographical Information Systems for railroads.
- Played a key role on the staff team assigned to develop and manage the *Midwest Regional Rail Initiative*, a collaborative effort involving 9 Midwestern states, Amtrak and the FRA. Reports summarizing the first two phases of the analysis of the feasibility of implementing a regional passenger rail system were published in August 1998. The third

phase of the study effort is underway and will be completed in early 2000. Upon completion of the third phase, the amount of funds expended on the *Midwest Regional Rail Initiative* will exceed \$2.3 million.

- Co-managed the preparation of a detailed feasibility study of high speed rail options between Chicago/Milwaukee and Minneapolis/St. Paul, a collaborative effort between the Minnesota and Wisconsin DOTs. The study is ongoing and will be completed in early 2000. Upon its completion, the amount of funds expended on the study will exceed \$600,000.
- Played a key role on the staff team assigned to assist the *Governor's Passenger Rail Task Force* fulfill its mission. The Task Force is required to submit an interim report to the Governor in December 1999 and a final report in December 2000.

In addition to the still active projects listed above, John Hartz is responsible for the producing a new State Rail Plan. The plan will have four major components: passenger rail, freight rail; rail-highway grade crossings, and a system-plan environmental evaluation. The target date for completing the initial Draft State Rail Plan is September 2000.

From 1990 thru 1992, John Hartz served as Chief of the Policy Analysis and Information Section. During this time, he was responsible for co-managing a feasibility study of high speed rail/maglev between the Chicago-Milwaukee and the Minneapolis-St. Paul metropolitan areas. He also played a key role in developing a Strategic Highway Safety Plan for the State of Wisconsin.

DIRECTOR, BUREAU OF TRANSIT

Wisconsin Department of Transportation (1978-1989)

John Hartz directed the management of state and federal assistance programs for all forms of surface public transportation including urban transit, specialized transportation for the elderly and the handicapped, ridesharing, rural public transportation and intercity public transit. The Transit Bureau's annual budget exceeded \$50 million in 1989.

As the manager of a major grouping of state transportation programs, John Hartz gained considerable knowledge of the decision-making process in the public sector and considerable experience in all facets of public administration. He has played a key role in shaping and implementing a major component of Wisconsin's state transportation laws and budgets.

In 1989, the Director of the Bureau of Transit directly supervised 11 full-time professional positions and indirectly supervised the work of many other professionals in the Wisconsin Department of Transportation -- particularly those assigned to work on transit matters in each of the Department's eight (8) Transportation District offices.

The major set of clients of the Bureau of Transit are Wisconsin's urban transit systems. Collectively, these systems operate over 1,200 buses, carry about 80 million passengers each year

and have an operating budget exceeding \$110 million annually. State transit aids administered by the Bureau of Transit paid 38.5 percent of this annual budget. By state statute the Bureau is mandated to oversee the efficient and effective operation of these systems.

John Hartz functioned as "chief of staff" for one of the most intensive and extensive analysis of transit policies, programs and priorities ever undertaken at the state level. In mid-1987, the Secretary of the Wisconsin Department of Transportation appointed a Select Committee to "assess, and possibly redefine, the role of the State of Wisconsin in supporting efficient and effective mass transit services in the state's urban areas." The committee began its works in September of 1987 and finalized its recommendations in June of 1988. During this period, staff, under the supervision of John Hartz, produced 14 Staff Reports and 23 Technical Memos. Hartz personally authored many of the documents.

Under John Hartz's leadership, the Bureau of Transit engaged in major technical assistance efforts to help its various sets of clients perform their missions more effectively and more efficiently. Two efforts having very high pay-backs and gaining national recognition involved the injection of microcomputer technology into the urban transit environment in Wisconsin and the creation of the Wisconsin Municipal Transit Insurance Commission in 1982 and of the Transit Mutual Insurance Corporation of Wisconsin in 1986.

John Hartz was the Department's principal liaison with Milwaukee County and regional planning officials in the study of rapid transit alternatives for the Milwaukee metropolitan area. These planning efforts have laid the foundation for a \$34 million capital improvement project known as the Milwaukee Northwest Corridor Express Bus Project. Over the years, Hartz gained a thorough understanding of the federally mandated "alternatives analysis" process for major public transportation investments and was instrumental in helping Milwaukee County obtain a \$25 million federal discretionary grant to implement the Northwest Corridor project.

On the national level, John Hartz played a key role in the development, implementation and refinement of guidelines governing the administration of federal programs authorized under Sections 16(b)(2) and Section 18 of the Urban Mass Transportation Act.

TRANSIT PLANNER TO SECTION CHIEF

Wisconsin Department of Transportation (1970-1978)

In 1970, John Hartz joined the Wisconsin Department of Transportation as its first employee to work full time on mass transit matters. In 1973, due in large part to work performed by Hartz and his small staff, Wisconsin's first state urban transit aid programs were enacted. In January of 1974, Hartz was named Chief of the newly formed Transit Assistance Section. 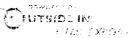

WHEREAS, the County intends to undertake a renovation project at the Township Auditorium (the "Project") in the approximate amount of \$12,000,000; and

WHEREAS, the County Council has been advised that the most efficient and costeffective manner in which to acquire the funds for the Project is to issue special obligations bonds payable solely from the local hospitality tax; and

WHEREAS, the County Council has been advised that it may be necessary to undertake portions of the Project prior to the issuance of the special obligation bonds; and

WHEREAS, the Internal Revenue Service and U.S. Treasury Department have promulgated Section 1.150-2 of the Treasury Regulations (the "Regulations") that authorizes an issuer to reimburse itself for expenditures made with respect to projects prior to the issuance of tax-exempt bonds for such projects; and

WHEREAS, the County Council has been requested to take action to:

- (1) authorize the implementation of the Project and the funding thereof including but not limited to putting into place the financing team;
- (2) declare its intent to fund the Project with the issuance of special obligation bonds payable solely from the local hospitality tax; and
- (3) declare its intent to reimburse certain expenditures (if any) which are incurred prior to the issuance of said special obligation bonds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Richland County, South Carolina, as follows:

- 1. The Interim County Administrator is authorized implementation of the Project;
- 2. Consult with Bond Counsel in the selection of a financing team which could include a financial advisor, underwriter, trustee, and underwriter's counsel.

- 3. The County Council hereby declares that this Resolution shall constitute its declaration of official intent pursuant to the Regulations to reimburse the County from the proceeds of the general obligation bonds of the County to be issued pursuant to Title 4, Chapter 14, Code of Laws of South Carolina 1976, as amended, for expenditures ("Expenditures") with respect to the Project. The County Council anticipates that it might be necessary to incur expenditures with respect to the Projects prior to the issuance by the County of its special obligation bonds payable solely from the local hospitality tax. To be eligible for reimbursement of the Expenditures, the reimbursement allocation must be made not later than 18 months after the later of (a) the date on which the Expenditures were paid, or (b) the date the Project was placed in service, but in no event more than three (3) years after the original Expenditures. The Expenditures are incurred solely to acquire, construct or rehabilitate property having a reasonably expected economic life of at least one (1) year, and the source of funds for the Expenditures with respect to the acquisition will be the County's general reserve funds.
- 4. In the event the special obligation bonds are not issued, the County Council will authorize an alternate funding source.
- 5. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption as provided by law. This Resolution shall be made available for inspection during normal business hours by the general public at the office of the County.
