

1. **CALL TO ORDER** - Chairwoman Cheryl English called the meeting to order at approximately 3:00 PM.

2. **APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

a. March 18, 2025 - Mr. Weaver moved to approve the minutes as distributed, seconded by Ms. Alleyne.

The vote in favor was unanimous.

3. **ADOPTION OF AGENDA** – Ms. Alleyne moved to adopt the agenda as published, seconded by Mr. Weaver.

The vote in favor was unanimous.

4. <u>ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION/ACTION</u>

- a. Alvin S. Glenn Detention Center- Status Updates
 - 1. Infrastructure Updates -
 - Vistiation Area (Attorney/Client): 95% Complete; All construction and interior finishes are complete. Awaiting delivery and installation of backordered communication call boxes. The project turns half of the Tango Facility into an Attorney Visitation area with 7 indirect and 3 direct contact units. The attorneys will access the area via a covered walkway from the main lobby just past security. The project has a security hallway to allow for detainee movement. This project was entirely designed and specified by an architectural design team and was solicited through a public bid process. Completion Date: June 15, 2025.

Mr. Weaver inquired if the attorneys are utilizing the attorney/client visitation area.

The County Administrator stated that it would not be utilized until the communication call boxes are installed and all work has been completed.

 Facility-Wide Security System: 20% Complete; Design phase completed. Construction drawings have been submitted and approved. Awaiting selection of contractor and permitting. The project's scope is to design and install a new camera and security control system throughout the facility. Completion Date: July 2026.

- Phase 5 Firm Alarm System Replacement: 95% Complete; Replacement of fire alarm panel and 90% of devices installed. The project's scope is to remove and replace the Fire Alarm system for all Phase 5 housing units. Completion Date: June 1, 2025.
- Hotel Housing Unit: 100% Complete; Completed and turned over to Detention Center for occupation. Completed: April 20, 2025.
- Juliet Housing Unit: 90% Complete; Interior finishes and MEP (mechanical, electrical, and plumbing) devices/fixtures are being installed. Estimated Completion Date: May 30, 2025.
- Lima Housing Unit: 65% Complete; Construction is in progress. Guardhouse construction completed. Interior finishes and MEP (mechanical, electrical, and plumbing) devices/fixtures are being installed. Estimated Completion Date: June 30, 2025.
- Kilo Housing Unit: 53% Complete; Construction is in progress. Guardhouse construction is in progress. Interior finishes and MEP (mechanical, electrical, and plumbing) devices/fixtures are being installed. Estimated Completion Date: June 30, 2025.
- Uniform Housing Unit: 59% Complete; Construction is in progress. Guardhouse construction is complete. Interior finishes and MEP (mechanical, electrical, and plumbing) devices/fixtures are being installed. Estimated Completion Date: May 30, 2025.
- Mike Housing Unit: 0% Complete; Proposals received from contractors on May 5, 2025. Proposals are being evaluated for the scope of work and contractor qualifications. Estimated Start Date: July 1, 2025. Estimated Completion Date: October 1, 2025.
- New Housing Unit Building 3 Stories; 288 Beds; Six 48-Bed Housing Units: 2% Complete; Cost Proposal received from Mosely Architects. Pre-construction meetings to discuss the scope have been completed. In June, Richland County staff will conduct site visits to neighboring detention facilities to help with Scope Development. Full scope and design criteria development to be completed in July 2025. Estimated Start Date: July 1, 2025 (Design). Estimated Completion Date: July 1, 2028 (Design & Construction)

Mr. Brown noted that when the Detention Center is at capacity, the County still must house any additional detainees brought into the facility. He pointed out that the new housing unit will not be an open-bed unit but configured similarly to the Mike Housing Unit.

Ms. Alleyne inquired if the housing unit renovations address the Department of Justice recommendations.

Mr. Brown responded in the affirmative.

Mr. Weaver asked how many years the expansion at the Detention Center would be expected to get the County through.

Mr. Brown indicated he believes the expansion would sustain the County for approximately five (5) years. He pointed out that there are individuals in the facility who need to be gone. Once the detainee has been sentenced or court-ordered to go to a mental health facility, the Detention Center should not be required to continue to house them.

The County Attorney, Patrick Wright, noted the Department of Justice had no findings regarding the physical facility.

2. Personnel Updates [EXECUTIVE SESSION] [Pursuant to SC Code of Laws, Sec. 30-4-70(a)(1) and (a)(2)]

3. Columbia Area Mental Health [EXECUTIVE SESSION] [Pursuant to SC Code of Laws, Sec. 30-4-70(a)(2)] – Mr. Brown noted last year Council approved an agreement for the County to enter into a contract with the Department of Mental Health through Columbia Mental Health to provide an inperson, on-site representative to work inside the Detention Center as a part of the mental health process. The County signed a Memorandum of Understanding. The Department of Mental Health went back and put it in contract language. The contract is for not more than two years and is for \$169,000, which takes it out of his threshold of \$100,000.

Ms. Alleyne moved to go into Executive Session, seconded by Ms. Little.

In Favor: Pugh, Little, Weaver, Alleyne, and English

The vote in favor was unanimous.

The Committee went into Executive Session at approximately 3:23 PM and came out at approximately 3:52 PM

Mr. Weaver moved to come out of Executive Session, seconded by Ms. Alleyne.

In Favor: Pugh, Little, Weaver, Alleyne, and English

The vote in favor was unanimous.

Ms. English indicated that the Committee entered into an Executive Session to receive legal advice. No action was taken in the Executive Session.

- 5. **NEXT STEPS**: Ms. English and Mr. Brown indicated their desire to implement programmatic changes that will improve the detainees' environment.
- 6. **ADIOURNMENT** Ms. Alleyne moved to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Mr. Weaver.

DJJ CAPITAL EXPENDITURE CHARGE PROVISO

- 67.17: DJJ: Capital Expenditure Charge. This new Senate proviso was amended on the floor requiring local governments using the juvenile detention services provided by the Department of Juvenile Justice (DJJ) to pay a capital expenditure charge of \$125 per day per child not to exceed 25 days to DJJ to cover capital expenditures and investments in the facilities that house such juveniles. This charge is in addition to the per diem charge of \$50 that offsets operating expenses. If full funding is not received by the local governments, then the remainder of the funds due shall be transferred to DJJ from the Local Government Fund on behalf of local governments. The transfer to DJJ on behalf of the local government shall be deemed to have been distributed to the local government. This is more than three times the amount that counties currently pay!
- SCAC continues to negotiate with the DJJ director and other stakeholders to work on a permanent solution to this issue through S. 374, a bill that is currently on the Senate calendar.
