STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA COUNTY COUNCIL FOR RICHLAND COUNTY ORDINANCE NO. ___-10HR

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE RICHLAND COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES; CHAPTER 26, LAND DEVELOPMENT; SO AS TO PROVIDE ACCESS TO SITES THROUGH THE USE OF A CROSS-ACCESS EASEMENT DURING THE SUBDIVISION PROCESS UNDER CERTAIN CONDITIONS.

Pursuant to the authority granted by the Constitution and the General Assembly of the State of South Carolina, BE IT ENACTED BY THE RICHLAND COUNTY COUNCIL:

<u>SECTION I.</u> The Richland County Code of Ordinances, Chapter 26, Land Development; Article II, Rules of Construction/Definitions; Section 26-22, Definitions; is hereby amended to include in the appropriate alphabetical order, the following definition:

<u>Cross-access easement.</u> An easement wherein a grantor conveys to a grantee, his/her/its heirs, successors in interest, and/or assigns, a perpetual nonexclusive easement that may include such matters as: vehicular and pedestrian access, ingress, egress; the location and amount of parking of vehicles; and/or landscaped areas; and/or any shared maintenance responsibilities.

<u>SECTION II.</u> The Richland County Code of Ordinances, Chapter 26, Land Development; Article X, Subdivision Regulations; Section 26-222, General Requirements; Subsection (d), Access Requirement for Subdivision; is hereby amended to read as follows:

- (d) *Access requirements*:
 - (1) Access requirements for <u>residential</u> subdivisions. All subdivisions, and/or subdivision lots, shall have direct access to a public or private road, with a minimum fifty (50) foot right-of-way and a minimum twenty (20) foot wide passable surface approved by the county engineer's office. Except for minor subdivisions, all subdivision lots shall have access only to interior subdivision roads.
 - (2) Access requirements for commercial subdivisions. All commercial subdivision lots shall have direct access to a public or private road, with a minimum fifty (50) foot right-of-way and a minimum twenty (20) foot wide passable surface approved by the county engineer's office, or a recorded cross-access easement, at least thirty (30) feet in width from the public or private road to the commercial site and approved by the county fire marshal.

<u>SECTION III.</u> <u>Severability</u>. If any section, subsection, or clause of this ordinance shall be deemed to be unconstitutional or otherwise invalid, the validity of the remaining sections, subsections, and clauses shall not be affected thereby.

SECTION IV. Conflicting Ordinances Repealed. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION V. Effective Date. This ordinance shall be enforced from and after _____, 2010.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS that I (WE) Richland County, South Carolina of the County and State aforesaid, hereinafter sometimes referred to as "Grantor" (whether singular or plural), for and in consideration of the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) to me (us) in hand paid, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged at and before signing and sealing of these presents, do hereby bargain, grant and convey to the SOUTH CAROLINA ELECTRIC & GAS COMPANY, a South Carolina corporation having its principal office in Columbia, South Carolina, hereinafter sometimes referred to as "Grantee", a right of way, over such route as Grantee has selected, having a width of Thirty Five Feet (35') feet from the centerline of said line upon, over, under and across lands of Grantor situated in the County of Richland, State of South Carolina, described as follows: Being a tract of land containing 76.6 acres, more or less, and being the same lands conveyed to Grantor by deed of Blue Cross Blue Shield of South Carolina, dated 10/13/2000, and recorded in the Register of Deeds Office for Richland County in Deed Book R0450 at Page 2423 (the "Property").

Said property is a tract of land located along the westerly side of Clemson Road at the intersection of Percival Road and Clemson Road.

Right of way is as more fully shown on South Carolina Electric & Gas Company drawing #PA-09247-60301, attached hereto as "EXHIBIT A".

Allowed Uses Within the Right of Way

Parking :

Vehicle parking is allowed on the right of way provided the vehicles parked are transient in nature and are legal to be driven on the highway. Height of vehicles shall not exceed thirteen feet, six inches. Grantee's facilities must be protected from vehicular traffic. Curbing is an example of a suitable barrier.

Signs and lighting:

Any signs or lighting fixtures installed on the right of way shall not exceed fifteen feet in height.

Landscaping: Any vegetative or other landscaping shall not exceed fifteen feet in height.

Grantor will contact Grantee prior to construction of these allowed uses. An encroachment permit may be required. However, this permit will not be unreasonably withheld, and will be provided at no cost to the Grantor.

Whereas, Blue Cross Blue Shield of South Carolina leases all or a certain portion of the property subject of this Right of Way Grant pursuant to that certain Lease between Richland County, South Carolina and Blue Cross Blue Shield of South Carolina, and joins in the signing of this Right of Way Grant for the purposes of granting its consent to such Easement Agreement and the grant herein in all required respects.

Together with the right to construct, maintain, operate, replace and alter thereon and thereunder one or more lines for the transmission or distribution of electric energy, consisting of supporting structures, overhead and underground conductors and lightning protective wires, municipal, public or private communication wires, guys, push braces and other accessory apparatus and equipment deemed by Grantee to be necessary or desirable thereof, as well as the right to install, maintain and use anchors and guy wires on land adjacent to the right of way herein granted.

Together also with the right from time to time to redesign, rebuild or alter said lines and to install such additional lines, apparatus and equipment as Grantee may at any time deem necessary or desirable, and the right to remove any line or any part thereof.

Together also with the right of ingress, egress, and access to and from the right of way across and upon the Property as may be necessary or convenient for purposes connected with said right of way.

Grantee shall have the right from time to time to remove or clear and keep clear such trees, underbrush, structures and other obstructions upon said right of way and such trees ("danger trees") beyond the same as in the judgment of Grantee may interfere with or endanger said lines or appurtenances when erected; provided that Grantee will pay to Grantor the fair market value of such danger trees at the time of cutting as determined by a registered professional forester, and the right of entry upon said Property of Grantor for all of the purposes aforesaid.

PROVIDED, however, any damage to the property of Grantor (other than to property cleared or removed as hereinbefore provided) caused by Grantee in the course of constructing, rebuilding or repairing said lines shall be borne by Grantee.

Reserving, however, to Grantor the right to cultivate and use the ground within the limits of said right of way, provided that such use shall not interfere with or obstruct the rights herein granted, and provided further that no building or other structure shall be erected by Grantor within the width of said right of way.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE RICHLAND COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES, CHAPTER 2, ADMINISTRATION; ARTICLE VII, BOARDS, COMMISSIONS AND COMMITTEES; SECTION 2-326, BOARDS AND COMMISSION CREATED AND RECOGNIZED; SUBSECTION (B), THE RICHLAND COUNTY PLANNING COMMISSION; SO AS TO SPECIFY THE BACKGROUND REQUIREMENTS FOR CERTAIN MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION.

Pursuant to the authority granted by the Constitution of the State of South Carolina and the General Assembly of the State of South Carolina, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL FOR RICHLAND COUNTY:

SECTION I. The Richland County Code of Ordinances, Chapter 2, Administration; Article VII, Boards, Commissions and Committees; Section 2-326, Boards and commissions created and recognized; Subsection (b), The Richland County Planning Commission; is hereby reorganized and amended as follows:

Each member of Richland County Council shall appoint one (1) person to represent their respective Council district, and the term of the member of the commission shall be coterminous with the term of the appointing Council member. Provided, however, that if a vacancy shall occur on Council, the member of the commission appointed by the vacating Council member shall complete his/her term. In addition, no more than two (2) members shall be appointed from the building industry and no more than two (2) members shall be appointed from the environmental community. Commission members may live in either the incorporated or unincorporated area of the County. Any person who is appointed to the commission after September 1, 2006 must reside in Richland County. In appointing members to the commission, council shall give due consideration as to whether applicants live in an incorporated or unincorporated area of the County.
 - (2) In addition, council may also consider an applicant's professional expertise, knowledge of the community, and his or her concern for the future welfare of the total community and its citizens. No member of the planning commission shall hold an elected public office in the county.
 - $(2\underline{3})$ The commission shall perform all duties provided by law.

The building industry and environmental community shall include persons involved in development, real estate, conservation, environmental or financial businesses related to those areas. (We can add more for specificity if we want) Having an interest will be defined as serving on a board for, having an immediate relative employed there or standing to gain economically or in some personal way from decisions made relating to those areas that come before the Planning Commission. Richland County Council will have the final say in determining if an individual falls into one of these categories. "
